Minutes from the Parish Council meeting held at 7.30 pm on Thursday 23rd March 2023 in the Village Hall

128/22	To receive and note public representation: M. Edkins has reported the broken mirror opposite the entrance to the VH, and also the blocked gutters on the Hollows. A member of public spoke about their objection to the planning application 23/00293/OUTM, two members of public shared their concerns about the road leading to the proposed development and that a good road (without potholes) with a 60mph speed limit would be extremely dangerous on that stretch.
129/22	To receive and accept apologies for absence: Apologies were received and accepted by Cllr Foster and Cllr Roger Jackson.

Planning Applications for consideration: 23/00293/OUTM - Outline application for demolition of existing research facility and erection of 5 no dwelling houses with all matters reserved except access. Research Centre, R91 Building, Priory Lane, Thurgarton – OBJECTED. 23/00316/HOUSE - Single storey rear extension. Charnwood, Bleasby Road, Thurgarton – SUPPORTED. B. 134/22	Finance: a. Payments for authorisation: Payments totalling £1093.86 were authorised plus. b. Balance of Accounts: NatWest Business Current Account balance as of 22 March 2023 is £27129.88 and the Reserve Account balance is £13287.63 c. To agree annual dog waste contract: The contract has been increased by 20p a collection, the PC voted in favour. d.To agree Clerk's new pay scale – agreed. g. VAT update: The Clerk confirmed that she sent the letter regarding the VAT query to HMRC and, as yet, not received a response.

A	Emergency Measures: NR reported: Defibrillator is in place and the Red Lion has all the information needed; she is still looking into getting a defib in the Village Hall. The defib is being registered on The Circuit. A resident's garden flooded in the week and S. Edkins used the village pumps; it was agreed that the pump is available to help residents in emergencies but ideally not for on-going and repeat issues. The flood defences itinerary is in place. The emergency plan is being looked at. The flood graph on the website is not working but is in the process of being fixed. TT reported: Flood Mitigation solution for the village progress report - Internal Drainage Board (IDB) still progressing project, still awaiting report from Balfour Beatty with costs. The project is still planned to be completed by Oct 2023.
В	Highways: AB reported: he is chasing the relocation of the flashing speed sign; he has been in touch with Highways about the permission to plant along the roadside. AB is liaising with Highways on working towards the concerns in the village – ongoing. M. Edkins is reviewing how we can keep SpeedWatch in the Village and she updated the PC on the new rules and requirements; the PC agreed to allocate £200 to cover the costs of new signs and some items needed to re-start the initiative.
С	Communications: TT reported: Forterra - are considering funding or donating towards the 2nd Defibrillator for the village. Will be contributing to the Spring Clean-up by working the road between the factory gate and the junction with the A612. Annual Parish Meeting - Notts Scouts to present Web site update to be undertaken KC reported that there are two dogs at Hill Farm who have attacked dogs in the village for the second time; it has been reported to the police.
D	Environment: DB reported: has been in touch with Scouts and agreed location of the new dog bin. DB put forward a quote for the re-painting the poles and posts and the PC voted in favour of accepting the quote from Alliance. Still awaiting the quote for electricity at the war memorial. The Spring clean was deferred due to the weather and will be held on the 29 th April. DB asked for a vote to agree the cost of a Coronation Flag and bunting at a cost of £180 – Voted in favour.
E	Village Hall: the front door has been completed, all in good running order.

137/22	To receive update and agree action for the village plan: KC has prepared a questionnaire which she will circulate to Cllrs to review before posting to villagers.
